

Zeeland Record Newspaper Digitization Project Update

- A quote estimate was received from the Clarke Historical Library at Central Michigan University
 for the re-digitization of the Zeeland Expositor/Record for years 1893-2006 and for microfilming
 and digitization of years 2007 to the present for a total of \$83,058
- Amanda Hanson, Director, is applying for the Clarke DigMichNews grant to mitigate the digitization project cost – the grant winner(s) will be determined by March 2024.

Professional Development Opportunity - Director

Amanda H. has been accepted into a working cohort of 25 public library directors from Library Class sizes III and IV (HML is a Class IV) to participate in the Post-Pandemic Public Library project of the University of Michigan School of Information and the Library of Michigan. The goal of the yearlong project is to "enhance the confidence, camaraderie, and skills of public library directors to strengthen

community relationships, communicate library impact more effectively, and respond to public queries with confidence and respect." Monthly 2-hour Zoom meetings will begin in January 2024 and each director will make a presentation to the group in the Spring 2025 relating their library's experience in the program and how it relates to their communities in Michigan. There is no cost to the director to attend and be a part of this project. Additionally, each library will participate in a small-group media training with a professional crisis communications expert from Hennes Communications which will prepare library directors to better respond to challenging and difficult conversations. Each library can also take advantage of a short community survey with analysis facilitated by UMSI.
